Lincoln City









With award-winning attractions, great shopping, and a wealth of places to eat and drink, Lincoln makes for the perfect city.

As Lincoln is a compact city, you can easily explore on foot. Start your day in the Cornhill Quarter, before hitting the shops on the High Street. After indulging in some retail therapy, you can take a relaxing stroll along the Brayford Waterfront, home to the award-winning University of Lincoln.

Tackle the famous Steep Hill and you will discover an array of independent shops, eye-catching buildings, and photo-worthy moments. Follow the cobbles and you'll find Lincoln Cathedral, the Medieval Bishop's Palace, and Lincoln Castle. These incredible attractions boast some of the finest architecture in the country, and a whole host of secrets are hidden within their walls.

There is even more history to unpack at the Lincoln Museum, the Museum of Lincolnshire Life and the IBCC, a moving memorial to honour all who served in WWII's Bomber Command. With such a variety of different things on offer, you'll find something to suit the whole family.





Bourne

A quintessentially English market town surrounded by beautiful countryside.

Bourne is nestled on the eastern slopes of the limestone Kesteven Uplands and the western edge of the Fens - an area rich in wildlife, culture and history, and renowned for its waterways, open spaces, parks, and woodland.

Bourne is a growing and bustling market town with many amenities, including a large leisure centre, outdoor swimming pool, snooker and sports bar, a range of restaurants, cafes and public houses, several gyms and a great selection of shops and businesses.

If you are a fan of road biking, you'll certainly never be short of back roads to explore with some truly stunning countryside and varied terrain to appreciate on-route. The woods and countryside around Bourne also provide a great location for those with mountain bikes.

Grantham

An attractive town on the border with Lincolnshire and Nottinghamshire; Grantham is the birthplace of Sir Isaac Newton. The town itself has some excellent attractions, including the National Trust Property Belton House, and Belton Woods hotel and golf course.

Grantham has been home to some notable residents including Isaac Newton, who was educated at the town's grammar school; Edith Smith, the UK's first female police officer in 1914, and Margaret Thatcher, who was the longest-serving Prime Minister of the 20th century and the first woman to hold the office.

Additionally, the town produced the first running diesel engine in 1892 and the UK's first tractor in 1896. A town steeped in history and heritage; Grantham truly shouldn't be missed.



Sleaford

An attractive and bustling market town surrounded by flat fenland countryside. whose skyline is dominated by the 144-foot stone spire of St. Denvs' Church.

Located on the River Slea and Sleaford Canal. Sleaford is home to the nationally acclaimed National Centre for Craft & Design. Pop by to experience exhibitions from the most innovative, challenging and accomplished artists, as well as new and emerging talent. For aviation buffs, there is the Cranwell Aviation Heritage Centre and RAF Digby Ops Room, both giving a fascinating insight into the history of British aviation.




Spalding

A historic and vibrant market town in the south of Lincolnshire. Historically known as the Flower Town, Spalding is celebrated for its beautifully preserved gardens, heritage, markets, and its Flower Parade. The town has a charming and inviting atmosphere, welcoming visitors to experience the heritage packed within its quaint streets.



Spalding is famous for its connection to Lincolnshire's horticultural industry. It celebrates this through the iconic Spalding Flower Parade, a renowned spectacle held annually every spring. This parade is a colourful showcase of floats adorned with vibrant flowers, along with music, entertainment, and a festival atmosphere that celebrates this unique history. The eye-catching floral parade and the familyfriendly activities that go alongside it, make it a fantastic event to pair with the Boston May Fair which happens around the same time in May. The Coast

The seaside resort of Skegness: visit the pier and beach, or the Embassy Theatre to be entertained. Explore Gibraltar Point Nature Reserve to explore the picturesque natural setting.

Sitting within North East Lincolnshire, Mablethorpe and Cleethorpes also have sandy beaches with something to offer. You can ride the sand train at Mablethorpe to make a full day at the coast.

Further south are Ingoldmells and Chapel St Leonards, which is part of the Castle to Coast cycle route from Lincoln.

You can also visit the natural coast of Anderby Creek or for even more entertainment, visit one of the several theme parks in the coastal area.

FINANCE

- Fee-paying places are available in both phases
- Salaried places are available only with support from an employing school
- The cost of the course is usually £9,250
- Tuition fee and maintenance loans are available through Student Finance England*
- For secondary training only, bursaries and scholarships are available, depending on teaching subject and degree class*

Bursaries and Scholarships

SECONDARY INITIAL TEACHER TRAINING

Postgraduate teaching bursaries and scholarships are only available for the subjects listed below. You cannot receive both a teaching bursary and a scholarship.

You must be eligible for student finance to receive a bursary or scholarship (unless you're training to teach physics or languages).

You cannot receive a scholarship or bursary if you're on a salaried teacher training course.

Bursaries

You do not need to apply for a bursary. If you're eligible, you'll automatically receive it.

To be eligible for a bursary, you'll need at least one of the following:

- a bachelor's degree class 2:2 (honours) or higher
- a master's degree
- a PhD

Scholarships

ELIGIBILITY

To be eligible for a scholarship, you'll need at least one of the following:

- a bachelor's degree class 2:1 (honours) or higher
- a master's degree
- a PhD

In exceptional circumstances, if you achieved a 2:2 in your degree you may still be awarded a scholarship if you have significant relevant experience.

Subject Knowledge Enhancements (SKE)

Secondary candidates might need to do a subject knowledge enhancement (SKE) course before starting teaching training, to top up their subject knowledge, if their degree is not related directly to the subject they wish to teach. This will be stipulated by your provider as a condition of your offer. There is an SKE bursary available, to financially support you, as you undertake this subject enhancement. PRIMARY INITIAL TEACHER TRAINING

Funding is available to help you train to teach. You can apply for a:

- tuition fee loan of up to £9,250 to cover your teacher training, so you do not need to pay course fees upfront
- maintenance loan of up to £13,022 to help with living costs

You can still apply for a tuition fee and a maintenance loan if you already have a student loan, and regardless of whether you get a teaching bursary or scholarship.

You will only have to make loan repayments once you're earning. Look at the student finance calculator here to see how much funding you may get.
